Description:

The upgrading works for the retaining walls at the terraces of Tsuen Wan and Cape Collinson Chinese Permanent Cemeteries comprise 15 features and 21 features respectively. The Works include the construction of soil nails and concrete skin walls to strengthen the existing masonry walls. The Works are scheduled to commence in Q4 2025 and complete in Q4 2026.

Contractors who must be included on the list of Approved Specialist Contractors for Public Works in the Category of "Landslip Preventive/Remedial Works to Slopes/Retaining Walls" under the Development Bureau of the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region and shall not be suspended from tendering at the time of the close of tender and have past experience in providing similar scale of works with at least one contract value not less than \$50 million in the past ten years.

Submission of Tenders:

Contractors who are interested in the tender should contact Mr Benjamin NGAI for the collection of tender documents at Wong & Cheng Consulting Engineers Limited's office. Sealed tenders, in duplicate, must be clearly marked with the tender reference and the subject of the tender on the outside of the envelope (but should not bear any indication which may relate the tender to the tenderer) and deposit to BMCPC tender box situated at 34/F, Wu Chung House, 213 Queen's Road East, Wan Chai, Hong Kong before closing date. Late tenders will not be accepted.

Remarks:

a. If a black rainstorm warning signal or a tropical cyclone warning signal No. 8 or above is in effect at any time between 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon on the closing date, tenders closing time will be postponed to 12:00 noon on the first working day after the black rainstorm warning signal has ceased to be in effect or the tropical cyclone warning signal No. 8 is lowered.

b. BMCPC reserves the right to negotiate with any tenderer about the terms of the offer.
